- 1. Log into *eLumen* from *Passport*. It is the second link from the bottom of the **Miscellaneous Quick Links**. Or click the following link: <u>https://ltcc.elumenapp.com/elumen/</u>.
- 2. Once in *eLumen* choose "Department Coordinator" from the pull-down menu.
- 3. Select the "SLOs & Assessments" tab.
- 4. Select the "Curriculum Map" tab. Verify that your department is listed in the pull-down menu underneath **Organization**.
- 5. Directly below that is another pull-down menu that has two radio buttons for "Core PSLOs" or "Core ISLOs." Select the radio button for "Core ISLOs."
- A table will appear with LTCC's Core Competencies across the top (Communication, Critical Thinking and Information Competency, Global Awareness, and Personal Responsibility and Professional Development). These serve as the Institutional Student Learning Outcomes (ISLOs) to which you will map your Course Student Learning Outcomes (CSLOs).
- 7. Your department's courses with each CSLO will appear in numerical order on the left. For each CSLO select the box(es) that correspond to LTCC's ISLOs. A selected box will turn green and have a check mark. On the right there is an arrow that allows you to scroll through all categories of the ISLOs. (Or you may select the categories individually in the pull-down menu below "Core ISLOs" that reads "- All Categories -.")
- 8. Continue until you have completed all of the courses for your department. It should look like the image below.
