PHLEBOTOMY TRAINING PROGRAM

This short term departmental certificate is offered in partnership with BartonHealth. The program includes both basic and advanced classroom instruction and is designed for all beginning students and for phlebotomists with less than 1,040 hours of phlebotomy experience. The two-course sequence begins in the Winter quarter with HEA 144A (Phlebotomy Training, Part 1 – Didactic) and concludes in the Spring quarter with HEA 144B (Phlebotomy Training, Part 2 - Clinical). Successful certificate completion requires perfect attendance and a final grade of "Passing" or higher (defined as 84% or higher) in HEA 144A and 50 successful patient venipunctures and 10 successful patient skin punctures (pursuant to CCR, Title 17) in HEA 144B. In order to apply for certification, students will be required to provide a certified copy of their high school transcripts or GED, as well as proof of the Hepatitis B series.
