BARTON ACCEPTING MEDICAL SUPPLY DONATIONS FACING GLOBAL SHORTAGE Businesses and Community can Donate Personal Protective Equipment, Make Facemasks

(*South Lake Tahoe, CA*) - In light of a global shortage of personal protective equipment due to the coronavirus COVID-19 pandemic, <u>Barton Health</u> is making every effort to ensure its supplies remain adequate for a potential influx of patients seeking care. Collaboration is underway with regional health partners, new and existing vendors, local businesses, and community members to procure equipment and supplies that may be needed as part of Barton's top priority of keeping healthcare workers and patients safe.

"This is an unprecedented time, with unprecedented solutions needed to solve constantly evolving issues," said Dr. Clint Purvance, President & CEO at Barton Health. "This crisis has brought people and industries together in a joint effort to slow the coronavirus' spread and save lives."

The Barton Foundation is organizing medical supply donations as a single access point to ensure safety criteria of donated supplies are met. The Barton Foundation is gratefully accepting personal protective equipment and medical supply donations such as facemasks (N95, surgical, and procedure masks), disinfecting wipes such as Clorox or Sani-cloth wipes, hand sanitizer, face shields, goggles and eye shields, isolation or surgical gowns, Controlled Air Purifying Respirator (CAPR) and Powered Air Purifying Respirator (PAPR) machines or disposables.
