Dear Students,

A quickly evolving situation regarding COVID-19 is forcing **Lake Tahoe Community College (LTCC) to move to a near-total campus closure starting Friday, March 20**. This means that the **entire campus will be closed to students**, the public, and most college employees effective immediately. We realize this is a different direction than the email you received earlier today. New developments require LTCC to make this change.

This unfortunately means canceling final exams that were planned for Friday. Faculty will reach out to these affected students to make different arrangements. Check your student email for updates. Online finals and assignments due next week will continue as planned unless you receive different direction from your faculty member.

College leadership understands this is an unsettling change that will cause real disruption, but it is absolutely necessary to take the step to close right now. Governor Gavin Newsom [issued a shelter-in-place order](#) Thursday evening for all Californians that took effect immediately. El Dorado County also issued [a shelter-in-place directive](#) that asks county residents to remain in their residences to the fullest extent possible. What these directives mean for all of us is that we are to remain at home except for “essential activities” to combat the spread of COVID-19.

We know all of this isn't easy – there's a global pandemic underway, and we're all concerned for our families, loved ones, our country, and all of those affected by this virus around the world. Having to abruptly shift how you live your life and how you learn is a real challenge. Be patient, and know that LTCC is here to support you.
