Students may be required to complete a supplemental residency questionnaire to clarify residency or apply for residency reclassification. Residency changes are not automatic. To be considered for residency, you must:

- 1) Be physically present in the state for at least one year and one day prior to the start of the quarter.
- 2) Show documentation of intent to establish residency.
- 3) Not be precluded from establishing residency by provisions of the Immigration and Nationality Act.

The burden of proof is on the student to clearly demonstrate both physical presence and intent to establish residency. All documents presented must be valid, legible, dated at least one year prior to the residence determination date and be properly identified with the student's name and address.

LAKE TAHOE COMMUNITY COLLEGE RESIDENCY - SPECIAL CONSIDERATION REQUIREMENTS

California regulations allow students meeting certain criteria to pay California resident fees even if they have not met the requirements of physical presence and intent to be a resident. To be considered under these special provisions, please see the applicable section below.

Self supporting minor

If you are under 19 years of age and have supported yourself financially for at least one year and a day, please provide <u>both</u> of the following:

- W-2 forms or other documentation showing your earnings for the past year.
- 2. A written statement showing your expenses during the past year.

Note: To claim this status, you must have been physically present in California for the past year.

☐ Member of the U.S. Military on active duty in California or maintaining domicile (primary home) in California

If you are a member of the United States Military (Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines, or Coast Guard) assigned to active duty for more than 30 days, please provide <u>one</u> of the following:

- 1. Evidence of the date of assignment to California on active duty status.
- 2. Documentation that you are assigned to active duty in any location and maintain your primary home in California.

Note: Members of the National Guard are <u>not</u> eligible for this exemption.

☐ Spouse or dependent child of a member of the military stationed in California or maintaining domicile (primary home) in California

If you are the spouse or dependent child of a member of the Armed Forces of the United States who is stationed in California, please provide <u>all</u> of the following:

- 1. Proof that the military member has been assigned to active duty for more than 30 days.
- Documentation of the military member's assignment to active duty in California OR proof of that the military member's primary home is in California.
- 3. Evidence that you are the spouse of the military member or a dependent child for federal tax purposes.

Discharged member of the U.S. Military remaining in California

If you were a member of the United States Military who was stationed in California for more than one year immediately prior to being discharged and you have remained in California for less than a year and one day, please provide a copy of your Military Discharge Form. You may be temporarily classified as a California Resident for up to one year, but will need to provide evidence of intent to establish California residency at the end of the one-year waiting period to maintain your residency status.

$\hfill\square$ Public school employee with a valid credential or emergency permit

If you are employed by a school district in a full-time position and hold a valid credential or valid emergency permit and are enrolled in courses to meet credential requirements, please provide <u>both</u> of the following:

- 1. Copy of your credential or emergency permit
- 2. Statement from your employer that you are employed in a full-time position requiring certification qualifications

□ Foster Care Youth/Emancipated Foster Youth

If you are or have recently been a foster care youth (ward or dependent of the State of California), please provide documentation showing this relationship.

- 1. Proof of employment
- 2. Proof that the student has not lived in California for more than one year since arriving or since attaining age 18, whichever came later.

If you are currently enrolled in police academy training courses and a public agency intends to classify you as a police officer upon successful completion of the courses, please provide evidence that the public agency intends to classify you as a peace officer.

Agricultural laborer for hire (or child of an agricultural laborer).

If you or your parent is seasonally employed in connection with production of agricultural crops including seeding, thinning and harvesting, please provide the following:

- 1. Evidence that you or your parent earned a livelihood by performing agricultural labor in California for at least two months during each of the preceding two years.
- 2. Dependents only: Evidence that your parent lives within the district and proof that your parent claims you as a dependent on his or her income tax forms

$\hfill\square$ Graduate of a school in California operated by the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs

If you are a graduate of a school operated by the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs that is located in California, please provide a copy of your diploma.

☐ Surviving dependent of any individual killed in the September 11th terrorist attacks

If you are a surviving dependent of an individual killed in the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks, please provide a copy of your written notice of eligibility for a tuition and fee waiver by the California Victim Compensation and Government Claims Board.
