

The COVID health-related questions will be asked of every employee and student:

1. In the past 14 days, exhibited any of the following COVID-19 symptoms? (Using the online [Center for Disease Control symptoms test](#): those symptoms include fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea, muscle or body aches). If “yes,” in order to return to campus, you must have
 - 72 hours symptom-free AND 10 days passed since the onset of symptoms OR
 - A negative test result and 24 hours symptom free
 - If symptoms are determined not to be COVID-19 related (according to the CDC survey), then 24 hours symptom free to return

2. In the past 14 days, have you tested positive for COVID-19? If “yes,” in order to return to campus:
 - At least 10 days have passed since the date of your positive test and 72 hours symptom free OR
 - You have received two negative tests since your positive test that are at least 24 hours apart

3. In the past 14 days, [have you been exposed](#) to someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 (with “exposure” defined as “closer than 6 feet to someone for more than 15 minutes”)? If “yes,” to return to campus,
 - A 14-day quarantine is *required* from date of exposure even if negative test results obtained
 - If you develop symptoms, refer to question #1 above.

4. [Have you travelled in the last 14 days](#)? If “yes,”

The Centers for Disease Control *recommends* a 14-day quarantine. Travel is considered a high-risk activity. We advise ongoing symptom vigilance and rigid safety protocol compliance as well as regular testing for at least 14 days following travel.

5. Have you gathered with 30 or more people in the past 14 days?

The Centers for Disease Control *recommends* a 14-day quarantine. This is considered a high-risk activity. We advise ongoing symptom vigilance and rigid safety protocol compliance as well as regular testing for at least 14 days following travel.

6. Have you gathered with people in the past 14 days where recommended safety protocol have not been followed?

The Centers for Disease Control *recommends* a 14-day quarantine. This is considered a high-risk activity. We advise ongoing symptom vigilance and rigid safety protocol compliance as well as regular testing for at least 14 days following this activity.
