Interstate Attendance Agreement Procedure -- Fall 2016

During the 2016 Fall quarter, LTCC will begin the process of granting an Interstate Attendance Agreement to Nevada residents in specific zip codes. Up to 100 Nevada residents who meet the parameters defined below will be granted a tuition rate of three times the California state rate (\$93.00 per unit). This is a savings of \$88 per unit from the \$181.00 per unit rate for nonresident students for the fall of 2016.

General Parameters

- Rate goes into effect for classes taken during, or after the 2016 Fall quarter.
- Students must be enrolled in at least six units each guarter
- Students must be a matriculant, which means the student is a degree, certificate or transfer seeking individual.
- Students can continue to receive the GNP rate provided they meet satisfactory academic progress each quarter. An appeal process is available to students who meet extenuating circumstances.
- Individuals must reside in the following zip codes:

K-8 students will not be considered for the special rate. High school students may apply.

Criteria

Applications will be accepted on a first come, first serve basis. Applications will be reviewed weekly and determination of eligibility will be made based on the following criteria:

- AB540 eligible students will be disqualified and asked to complete the AB540 form.
- Incomplete applications will be disqualified.
- The student must meet the standard for Nevada residency based on physical address, minimum time in the state and legal capacity to establish residency.
- Existing California residents who have moved to Nevada will be given priority assuming the student meets other eligibility criteria.
- When the Director of Enrollment Services determines that the number of students is approaching cap, other factors may be considered such as:
 - o Full time vs. part time status
 - o Intent to be a continuous student as determined by the student's educational goal
 - o Graduation or attendance at a local high school
 - Student is part of a special partnership program with LTCC.

Students who are not approved due to being over cap will be notified that they can re-apply the following quarter or pay non-resident fees in the current quarter.

Students who move from Nevada to California:

- If previously grandfathered into the GNP rate, the student will be allowed the minimum time necessary to establish residency (one year + one day) from the time of the move. A residency hold will be placed on the student's record to require proof of CA residency at the one year mark.
- If previously coded out of state or a new student, the student will not be considered for GNP while residing in California. The student would be required to go through the usual residency process.
- In both cases, staff should determine whether the student may be eligible for AB540.
