Superintendent/President Dr. Kindred Murillo will provide an update on the following:

1. 2014 General Obligation Bond and the Friends of Measure F Campaign

# 2. Incarcerated Student Program

On November 11, 2014, the Lake Tahoe Community College District (LTCC) took action to approve the Incarcerated Student Program. With this program, LTCC will develop and implement a program that will provide an associate degree to individuals incarcerated in a correctional institution. This program will be a cost-effective and the curriculum will be offered through the distance education program offered on a correspondence basis with supplemental support activities such as orientation, assessment, and tutoring.

- 3. Notice of Intent for the LTCC Baccalaureate Pilot Degree Program On November 11<sup>th</sup> the LTCC Board of Trustees also took action to approve the Notice of Intent for a Baccalaureate Degree Pilot to be submitted to the Chancellor's office. In September 2014 Senate Bill 850 was passed and authorizes the Chancellor's Office to establish a baccalaureate degree pilot program. This opportunity is limited to 15 campuses from 15 different districts over eight years. The Request for Proposal is anticipated to soon be released this month.
- 4. University Center Charitable Pledge Agreement Roberta Mason, LTCC's current Board of Trustees President, is preparing to retire from the Board after 40 years of dedication and service. During this time, she has been working with a donor who wishes to give a generous five million donation to the LTCC Foundation to establish a university center at LTCC. The LTCC Board of Trustees took action on November 11<sup>th</sup> approving the pledge agreement; this item will appear before the Foundation Board of Directors for consideration of approval later in the agenda. The plan for the college's general obligation bond was to fund \$825,000 to remodel a portion of the existing college to pilot a university center, however, this donation provides funding for LTCC to construct a stand-alone full scale university center on the campus in

leveraging the bond funds with this significant donation.

### 5. LTCC 2015 Foundation Board Retreat

Staff has been working to identify times with the administrative team and facilitator before sending out a call for availability to the LTCC Foundation Directors. A Doodle poll will soon be circulated in an effort to identify the best time for the Foundation Board of Directors and staff will begin working on an agenda for the retreat. Board members are encouraged to send their agenda items in advance and the official date will be announced soon.

**Updates** 

Julie Booth reviewed the following:

**2014 Annual Taste of Gold Event:** The event brought in a total of \$32,920 and expenses were finalized at \$12,565. There was an increase in ticket sales, auction items and donations. The additional funds spent for the 2014 event were generated by purchasing additional food and wine along with quality entertainment for a better guest experience. The Board encouraged the Foundation staff to bring back the Josh Pfeiffer band for the 2015 event.

August 20, 2014 AGENDA ITEM NO. IV.A.

Annual Fund Campaign: The annual fund campaign was rebranded as the Student Success Campaign in an effort to match the name with the act of contributing directly to the success of LTCC students. The campaign highlights the major accomplishments of the LTCC Foundation and its impact on supporting and promoting students at the college. Staff is encouraging 100% participation from the Board to show a united level of commitment and support to the mission of the Foundation. Updates on the progress of the campaign will be provided at future meetings.

**Employee Contribution Campaign:** Staff is preparing to launch a new employee contribution campaign to encourage the faculty, staff and administrators to support the Foundation's efforts.

Friends of LTCC Soccer Club: The new launch of the men's and women's intercollegiate soccer teams has received a great deal of support from the campus and local community. On Oct. 3<sup>rd</sup> the Foundation sponsored alongside the Classic Cue, the first in-conference double header home game to launch the new club, team, logo and mascot. Over 300 community members, faculty and staff, and students came out to support the teams. The Foundation gained a great deal of exposure and new supporters of the Friends of LTCC Soccer Club.

#### Foundation's Speaker Spotlight Series

The Fall Quarter STEM speaker is scheduled for October 27<sup>th</sup> from 6-7:30 p.m. in the Board/Aspen room and will feature a neurological physics student, Jesse Livezey. Everyone was invited to attend this Foundation sponsored event.

#### Finance Committee Report

Bob Novasel and Jeff DeFranco reported the items reviewed in the recent Finance Committee Meeting. The committee took action to recommend designating funds to an additional Foundation wall, and establishing a merchant services account with Official Payments to allow the Foundation to take mobile payments at events.

The quarterly financials will be presented at the next regular meeting scheduled in November.

# English as a Second Language (ESL) Scholarship Fund Update

In May of 2013, the Foundation Board of Directors took action to designate \$5,000 to the ESL Scholarship Fund for the 2014/15 year. The Rotary International Club has also recently donated \$4,000 to this fund to Support the ESL Scholarship and the LTCC Foundation. Dr. Bob Cliff provided updates on the progress of the subcomittee comprised of Dr. Cliff, Tere Tibbetts, Megan Waskiewicz, and Diane Bisbee. The group offered a survey to identify the needs of the students to begin planning workshop offerings. LTCC staff member Georgillis Ortega has offered to facilitate workshops offered in the spring term.

# Superintendent/President's Report

Dr. Kindred Murillo noted the Measure F Campaign has reached nearly \$51,000, exceeding the \$35,000 allocated by the Foundation.

Phone banking efforts are still taking place and an additional mailer going out to the voters is being created. Despite recent articles against Measure F, the support is overall positive and the community understands the need to modernize and maintain LTCC. Dr. Murillo acknowledged Diane Lewis for her PR efforts and contributions to the campaign.

SUBJECT: Consideration of Acceptance of Gifts and Donations, University Center

Charitable Pledge Agreement

As Board President Roberta Mason prepares to leave after forty years on the Lake Tahoe Community College (LTCC) Board of Trustees, she has been working diligently with a donor who wishes to give a very generous donation to establish a university center at LTCC. The donation to the LTCC Foundation requires the approval of the Board of Trustees who took action on November 11, 2014.

The plan for the college's general obligation bond was to fund \$825,000 to remodel a portion of the existing college to pilot a university center in South Lake Tahoe. This donation provides funding for LTCC to construct a stand-alone full scale university center on the campus, through leveraging the bond funds with a significant private donation. Staff will provide a project proposal to the Board of Trustees at the December 2014 meeting if the University Center Charitable Pledge Agreement is approved by LTCC Foundation Board.

While the donor has not requested to be anonymous, her preference is for the donation of \$5 million to construct a university center be handled in a low-key manner by the college.

# **Terms of Agreement:**

- 1. On or before November 21, 2014, Charity (Lake Tahoe Community College Foundation) shall obtain approval for the Project and approval of a commitment to build and fund the Project from Charity's Board of Directors and the College's Board of Trustees. The estimated cost of the Project is Five Million Eight Hundred and Twenty-Five Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$5,825,000), and the Charity and College will be responsible for funding all of the cost of the Project other than the Five Million and 00/100 Dollars (\$5,000,000) pledged by the Donor.
- 2. The Donor pledges to Charity the sum of Five Million And 00/100 Dollars (\$5,000,000) to be paid as follows:

- 1. Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) five (5) days after the Board has approved the Project. The Board has committed to funding of the cost of the entire Project.
- 2. One Million (\$1,000,000) after the first day of any site work;
- 3. One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) after the completion of sixty five percent (65%) of the Project; and
- 4. Final One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) after the completion of the Project.
- 5. All payments to the Charity are conditioned upon the Charity being qualified within the meaning of 501(c)(3), 170(b) and 2055 (a).

Staff is requesting the LTCC Foundation Board of Directors approve the University Center Charitable Pledge Agreement.

**SUBJECT:** Consideration of Approval of Designating Program Support for the Baccalaureate

Pilot Degree Program

With the passage of SB 850 (BLOCK) Baccalaureate Degree Program in September 2014, California community college's (CCC) will have an opportunity to participate in a pilot program to offer baccalaureate degrees on a limited basis. SB 850 authorizes the Chancellor's Office to establish a baccalaureate degree pilot program. Specifically, the bill: 1) excludes degrees already offered by UC and CSU; 2) limits participation in the pilot program to 15 campuses from 15 different districts; 3) authorize the pilot for 8 years beginning January 1, 2015, and sunsets on July 1, 2023; 4) prohibit fees for lower division coursework in a BA program from exceeding fees for other lower division coursework; and 5) would require the Board of Governors to develop a funding model by March 2015.

In response, Lake Tahoe Community College District (LTCC) has established a Baccalaureate Degree Steering Committee (Committee), comprised of faculty, staff, administrators and a Board member. This Committee has met, developed criteria to evaluate programs and is actively working to meet the required timelines. It is requested that community colleges interested in applying submit a notice of Intent for the Baccalaureate Degree Pilot. The Request for Proposal is anticipated to be released during the middle of November. On November 11, 2014, the LTCC Board of Trustees took action to approve the notice of intent and the District is looking to the LTCC Foundation to support this program if chosen by the Chancellor's Office. The opportunity for the Lake Tahoe area to offer and establish a baccalaureate degree program is critical to the mission of LTCC
