Discussion & Reports

TRiO Program Presentation

Anna Lee updated the Board on the Textbook Lending Program noting this program is one of the most desirable services that LTCC offers.

Books each year are on average \$1,000 to \$2,200. Students who are TRiO participants, CTE students, Veterans and their dependents, EOPS students, and CalWORKs students are eligible for free textbooks.

The LTCC Foundation is the largest contributor of the program totaling \$17,445 since 2011. From this, over 2,600 checkouts have been made and low-income students have saved over \$154,000 in three years.

March 19, 2014 AGENDA ITEM NO. III.A.

Dr. Bob Cliff asked Anna to try to analyze how many additional funds would be needed to help additional students. Anna noted \$5,000 would provide the Textbook Lending Program the opportunity to replenish the inventory of changing books for the 2014/15 fiscal year.

Foundation Event & Campaign Updates

Aaron McVean reviewed the following:

Fill the Frame Campaign: The sculpture is on target for the big reveal scheduled for June 7th, 2014. Additional costs have been realized due to some unforeseen expenses. Currently, over \$63,000 has been raised and almost \$50,000 in expenses has been spent. Following the final payment to the Foundry and misc. contingent expenses, Annual Fund dollars may be needed to cover the final costs of the project.

40th **Anniversary Book Campaign:** Diane Lewis has been working with Kim Wyatt to finalize the first chapter of the book. Dr. Murillo noted Del Laine has been instrumental to help raise the remaining \$15,000 needed. They are looking to have 15 people pledge \$1,000 dollar donations; \$3,000 has already been raised. Staff has the rare and unique opportunity to work closely with Dr. Duke, Mrs. Roberta Mason, and Dr. Fritz Wenck, Jr. who has been with the District since its inception

2014 Taste of Gold Event: Aaron asked the Board for their support to increase the level of attendance along with sharing sponsorship information with anyone who might be interested. Last year nearly half of the Taste of Gold revenue came from corporate and private sponsors; any help from the Board is welcomed.

2013/14 Scholarships: Staff is hopeful to raise the same amount of dollars as last year. Aaron reviewed the new scholarships that have been created for this season.

The General Obligation Bond process is moving forward and Dr. Murillo is working with the District attorney to identify how/if the Foundation can support the efforts. The campaign will be ran efficiently and honestly.

SUBJECT: Consideration of Approval of 2014/15 TRiO Booklending Program Support

In November 2011, the LTCC Foundation provided \$9,445 in seed money to start a book lending program for TRiO students and other low-income, educationally disadvantaged students since the cost of purchasing textbooks three times each year is the greatest financial barrier these students face. Currently, there is approximately \$2,266 remaining in the restricted account, and the TRiO-SSS program that manages the book lending program has expressed interest in additional funding from the Foundation in the amount of \$5,000 to continue to purchase updated texts and keep the inventory current.

Recommendation

It is recommended the Foundation Board approve support for the 2014/15 TRiO Booklending Program in the amount of \$5,000 as presented.
