### 1. Fill the Frame Campaign

Staff will review the Fill the Frame Campaign and successful unveiling of the *Ascending* sculpture that took place on June 7<sup>th,</sup> 2014. The Campaign has remained open to recover the costs of installation, and two additional donations totaling \$750 have been received since the unveiling. Staff is now looking to finalize the installation of the permanent memorial sign.

### 2. 2014 Annual Taste of Gold Event

Staff will review the income to date for the 2014 Taste of Gold event. Sponsorships totaled \$27,500 and an increase in ticket sales and silent auction/donations from 2013 were also generated. Staff is already excited to begin planning for the 2015 Taste of Gold and looks forward to building on the excitement from this year's event.

On June 24<sup>th</sup>, 2014 the Lake Tahoe Community College District (LTCCD) Board of Trustees took action to support Resolution Number 20, and approved the ordering of a bond election. "Measure F" is a Proposition 39 general election bond that will require 55% voter approval of all registered voters in the District.

The Measure F Committee is recommending a more grass roots effort, with the advice from a campaign consultant. The measure F Committee has set a target of raising \$45,000 and the leadership team has recommended committing to spending \$35,000 on the campaign until more than \$35,000 has been raised.

Through consultation with legal staff, the LTCC Foundation may support and raise funds for the LTCCD General Obligation Bond (GOB) under the Foundation's Articles of Incorporation.

The attorney recommended that if we desire to raise funds for the bond campaign that we raise the funds utilizing the underlined purpose in the Foundation Articles of Incorporation, and any other uses the money may go to if we raise more funds than we need. When publicizing, we should include the phrase in our Articles of Incorporation"

"raise funds for the general welfare of students and the faculty of Lake Tahoe
Community College", and note the funds may be used for assist in funding the Measure
F campaign, provide funds for general programs and services, or assist in funding
capital campaigns.

### Articles of Incorporation state:

The purposes of this corporation include, without limitation, the advancement of public education, to receive gifts, bequests, or devises, to expend moneys or to provide gifts for the general welfare of the students and faculty of Lake Tahoe Community College District, to finance the acquisition, construction and improvement of educational facilities for the Lake Tahoe Community College District and to do any other or thing to engage in

and carry on any other activity connected with or incidental to promote, assist, aid or accomplish any of the forgoing purposes.
