Lake Tahoe Community College has been making notable progress on the regular and ongoing assessment of student learning outcomes and on enhancing the integrity of the published catalog by reviewing and inactivating many courses that are not offered on a regular cycle.

The college showed a significant increase in assessment completion of course-level SLO assessments from 70% in the 2015 fall quarter to over 95% completion in the 2016 fall quarter. Additionally, an improved Annual Program Review process that enhances reflection and closes the loop on programmatic changes based on assessment data has led to more engaged discussion around teaching and improvements leading to increased student learning.

LTCC transfer numbers are clearly exceeding the college's Institution-Set Standards (411 transfers over the 165 Institution-Set Standard). This number now includes students who, given our unique

bi-state location, transfer to four-year colleges and universities in Nevada. The college will likely choose to reexamine that standard.

The number of students achieving certificates and degrees in CTE areas continues to lag behind the institution's standard. Changes are being made to allow the college to track more of the "Employable Skills Certificate" completers, and the college is working very closely with our Advance: Adult Education partners on pathways into and through more and better CTE degrees and certificates. Additionally, the college is engaging degree audit capabilities to assist in outreach to and encouragement of eligible students who have not applied to receive certificates.
