Given the 400-year history of slavery and systemic racism in the United States, compounded with the unnecessary violence forced on people of color and the murder of George Floyd on May 25, 2020, it is no surprise strangers came together in the midst of a pandemic, in cities large and small, demanding change. We watched the burning skyline of Minneapolis spark protests in the United States and across the globe while hearing conversations of institutional and person-to-person racism all around us. **We know we must act.** 

We acknowledge that students, faculty, and staff experience systemic inequity and cultural racism.
