


While Fall enrollment information has been previously shared, this is the first look now that the census date (9/30) has passed.

Census date at most institutions is around the second week of classes, usually marking the end of the add/drop period.


This 'snapshot' of data is used for state and federal reporting. However, the numbers will change some as the term continues.

Fall 2022 enrollment reflects LTCC's continuing efforts to re-energize the campus with more students returning in

person.



On-campus student presence can also be viewed at different times during the day. Very useful information for event planning.




#### Historical Lookback at Fall FTES Values



Fall 2019 has become a 'baseline term' given that it was the last Fall prior to COVID, however it is important to remember that it was a banner term at the College after years of growth.



## Fall to Fall Persistence Rate First-Time, Full-Time Matriculants




The Fall term listed on the chart is the term in which the student first registered and the percentage displayed reflects the persistence rate of those returning in the subsequent fall term.

Example: Of the 134 students in the Fall 2021 cohort, 85 registered for Fall 2022

Persistence Rate of Fall 2021 first-time, full-time students returning this fall is 63%. Higher than the previous three years.

# Greatest Area Impacted by COVID: Physical Education (PE)

With the opening of campus in Fall 2020, enrollment has been increasing as credit and noncredit face-to-face course offerings are made available. Credit PE courses have increased WSCH by 33% compared to the previous fall but are still down at 16% compared to Fall 2019. Noncredit PE courses have a similar pattern with an increase of 59% compared to last year, but down 8% from Fall 2019.






## Lake Tahoe College Promise Program – Fall 2022


Lake Tahoe College Promise Students Registered for Fall 2022



Of the Promise students enrolled in Fall 2021, their Fall-to-Fall persistence rate is greater than first-time full-time non-Promise students. -> 76% compared to 42%



### Rising Scholars Program (RSP) – Fall Term Trend



The Program has been impacted by CA Dept of Corrections and Rehabilitation transferring students to other locations within the state as well as an increase in early releases after COVID lockdowns.



Facilities with more than 10 students include: El Centro Detention Center's Jr/Sr HS, Folsom State Prisons (men and women), High Desert State Prison, Growlersburg Conservation Camp, CA State Prison -Sacramento, and Sierra Conservation Center


