REFUNDS

LTCC's policy on refunds applies to fees charged for credit classes including enrollment fees, non-resident tuition, material fees, and facility use fees. Students must initiate a refund request. Refunds can take up to 15 business days to process if fees were paid by check.

Canceled Classes: All funds are fully refundable if LTCC cancels a class.

Dropped Classes: If a student chooses to drop a class before it starts, all fees are refundable with a few exceptions. To receive a refund on or after a class starts, the drop must happen by:

- 12-week classes: Friday of the 2nd week of the class
- 6-week classes: Friday of the 1st week of the class
- All other classes: Drop prior to the 10% point of the class, determined by calendar days
- Art material fees: If a student drops an Art class after receiving materials, refunds will be pro-rated based on the amount of materials used

Health & Student Representation Fees: Refundable if all classes are dropped before the refund deadline for 12-week classes.

Field Trips & Optional Fees: Refunds are possible if the drop is made two weeks before the first class meeting. After this, refunds are only possible if the student dropping can be replaced by another student who registers and pays all fees. This is not guaranteed.

Service Fees: Most are non-refundable. These are fees for challenge exams, transcripts, replacement diplomas, replacement certificates, and other similar services.

If you cannot attend college full time, the California Grant Fee Waiver (formerly Board of Governor's Fee waiver) could be for you! Both part-time and full-time students who do not qualify for the Lake Tahoe College Promise can apply for a fee waiver. This option is available to California residents and AB540-eligible students. REQUIREMENTS

-  Must be a first-time college student (previously completed less than 15 units)
-  Must be a California resident (includes undocumented students); or have attended 3 years of high school in California; or be Nevada resident from the eastern part of Lake Tahoe. Or a Washoe Tribal Member or their descendant from any state in the U.S.
-  Must attend at least one in-person class every term
-  Attend the "Understanding Transfer" class on your second or third term in the program
-  Enroll in 15 units per primary quarter (Fall, Winter, Spring) whenever possible; a minimum of 12 units is required
-  Maintain academic progress and a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0
-  Complete a comprehensive Educational Plan your first year at LTCC
-  Regularly meet with your dedicated Promise Counselor and Peer Navigator to ensure you stay on track!
-  Attend at least one Lake Tahoe College Promise event, workshop or activity each quarter
-  Submit a FAFSA or CA Dream Act application each year
-  Attend a seminar course in the Fall or Winter quarter of your first year

ASYNCHRONOUS

Learning doesn't necessarily happen at the same time for instructor and students; classwork often consists of independent reading, prerecorded video watching, and other tasks students complete on their own.

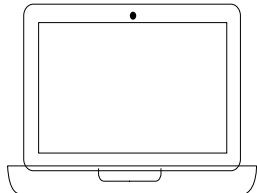
SYNCHRONOUS

Learning happens in real time between your instructor and your class either face-to-face, or via Canvas, Zoom, or other virtual spaces. Classwork deadlines are often scheduled on consistent days/times, providing structure for those who prefer that.

F2F

Face-to-Face

These are traditional courses that meet at set dates and times on campus. Please note that under certain emergency conditions, F2F classes will move to the EVE format.



Distance Education

Traditional distance education classes that take place online through Canvas and do not meet at a set time.



Hybrid

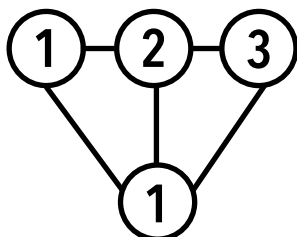
Hybrid classes include a combination of in-person meetings at specific days/times AND online activities. The online portion of the class may be synchronous or asynchronous.



Enhanced Virtual Education (EVE)

EVE classes are offered online and use the Canvas system for base information and resources, but they also use Zoom as well as other technologies to provide more "real time" contact. They are intentionally designed for students who prefer a face-to-face classroom feel.

Common Course Numbering



California Community Colleges is moving to a Common Course Numbering system to make it easier for students to earn credits and transfer. Class numbers will be changing to match all other community colleges in California. There will be no changes in how the class will transfer or the GE area that the course meets. Each year, you will notice more and more classes assigned new numbers as we shift to the new system. An example is ENG-101 being renamed ENGL- C1000. HEA-140E EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN (EMT) 12.25 UNITS


NOTE: The Mandatory EMT orientation must precede enrollment.

PREREQUISITE: Mandated by Barton HealthCare for all students with direct patient contact in the clinical setting. To provide documentation of two doses of Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR) immunization or positive antibody titers; two doses of varicella vaccination (Chickenpox) OR positive antibody titer; documentation of Hepatitis B vaccination OR positive Hepatitis B surface antibody titer; screening for documented history of Tetanus, Diphtheria, and Pertussis (Tdap) vaccination; and results of a recent TB test within the last year. Students with a history of a positive PPD (Tuberculin skin test) or Quantiferon blood test in the past must provide a chest x-ray report and/or documentation of any medical treatment for TB. During flu season (September through March) students must provide documentation of annual flu vaccination. Covid vaccination and boosters.
