ABOUT

Students who live on-campus are more likely to stay enrolled, earn a higher GPA, and complete their education.

The Lake Tahoe Basin is facing a housing shortage that has reached crisis levels. The impacts of the situation are real:

- More than half of all workers in Lake Tahoe don't live in the Basin, which contributes to traffic congestion and environmental impacts.
- Only 25% of South Lake Tahoe's population can afford a median-priced home.
- The number of Tahoe residents under the age of 24 is steadily declining and the lack of housing is a primary driver of young people getting uprooted from the Tahoe Basin.

LTCC has worked to bring student housing to the Tahoe Basin for a decade. Support for the idea came out of the Visioning process held at LTCC in 2013. The 2014 voter approval of Measure F allowed the college to move forward with planning. These efforts ensured LTCC was well positioned to successfully apply for California Student Housing funding in 2021. In June of 2022, LTCC was awarded \$39.3 million to construct a 100-bed on-campus affordable housing facility to serve low-income and full-time students. The building will open in Summer of 2025.



FACILITY LOCATION

The Student Housing Facility is positioned on campus to provide easy access to public transportation at LTCC's Mobility Hub and connecting bicycle and pedestrian paths heading both north and south of campus. The facility will be approximately 32,000 sq. ft. with separate living units,



and shared community spaces. The side facility entrance sits in close proximity to the college's Student Center, to provide quick and easy access to the main LTCC campus buildings.
