LTCC STUDENT SUPPORT PROGRAMS

Each program provides support and services to students based on need and goals of the program. Students must apply, meet eligibility criteria and complete agreements before being admitted into the programs.

Lake Tahoe Promise Program

For students who wish to complete their A.A. degree and/or transfer to another college or university within two years, or three if needed for additional coursework and support.

Eligibility:

- First time college students
- Attend full time (at least 12 units)
- CA & neighboring NV residents in Tahoe basin
- CA & NV Undocumented students

Support and Services:

- Free tuition for up to 3 years.
- Financial aid, counseling, career and transfer support.
- \$100 LTCC book credit
- Access to textbooks, laptops, priority registration and Peer Navigator support.

Program Requirements:

- Must attend in-person
- Stay enrolled full-time
- Maintain a 2.0 GPA or higher
- Submit a quarterly progress report
- Meet with Promise Counselor once a month
- Enroll in the Promise Class during the first year
- Participate in a campus event once a quarter, or mentor or tutor check-in

Equity Leaders Program

is specifically designed to assist underrepresented students in their educational journey by removing barriers and meeting individualized needs.

Eligibility:

- Demonstrate financial need
- Be from an underrepresented student group: ethnic minority, former/current foster youth, homeless, undocumented, and first-generation college student.
- Part time and full time students

Support and Services:

- High emphasis on mentorship and community.
- Access to textbooks, laptops, calculators, tutoring, school supplies, transfer trips, priority registration, workshops, and cultural events.
- Leadership, career, transfer, and academic support.
- Connection to campus and community resources.

Program Requirements:

- Maintain a 2.0 GPA or higher
- Submit a quarterly progress report
- Meet with a counselor once a quarter
- Participate in a campus event once a quarter, or mentor or tutor check-in

Extended Opportunity Program and Service (EOPS)

provides above and beyond academic, career and personalized counseling support for students with economic and educational challenges.

Eligibility:

- Students must be considered low-income California/AB 540 residents.
- Full time students (at least 12 units)
- Completed no more than 105 college units
- Educationally disadvantaged

Support and Services:

- Career and personal counseling
- Priority registration, tutoring, school supplies and gift cards for purchasing textbooks and supplies.

Program Requirements:

- Cannot exceed 105 units
- Meet with a Counselor at least twice each quarter
- Submit a quarterly progress report
- Maintain a 2.0 GPA or higher

Cooperative Agencies Resources for Education (CARE)

CARE is an extension of the EOPS program designed for single parents of children under the age of 14 who are receiving CalWORKs/TANF. The program provides additional financial assistance and resources to qualifying students by way of programs specially tailored to the needs of CARE students. In addition to EOPS services, cash grants are also offered to students.

California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKs)

provides services to students who are receiving Temporary Aid to Needy Families (TANF). In addition to EOPS/CARE services, paid work study opportunities and paid child care is also offered to students.


