

At the June scholarship awards ceremony, 90 continuing and transferring students received 150 awards. Scholarship support increased again for the 2019/20 academic year to an all-time high of \$165,000!

## **Helping Students Succeed**

### **Student Profile: Justiss Roque**

After graduating from South Tahoe High in 2016, Justiss Roque enrolled at LTCC. She knew she wanted to help others and discovered sociology, which gave her the tools to do just that.

Her own disability introduced her to the Disability Resource Center (DRC), whose staff became a valuable support system as she adjusted to her new college life. She ended up working at the DRC, which further cemented her desire to work with the disabled.

Justiss graduated from LTCC in June 2019, and she received scholarships from AAUW, HERO, and Soroptimists International of South Lake Tahoe. Thanks to these generous scholarships, she is currently attending Sacramento State, where she's pursuing a degree in social work. Keep up the great work, Justiss!

### **Student Profile: Tonisha Wesley**

Tonisha Wesley grew up in Sacramento in a single-parent household. She didn't have much family support, but she found a tremendous amount of support at school and teachers who inspired her to reach for the stars!

Tonisha graduated high school in 2012, but she had to cut her plans for higher education short when she discovered she was pregnant. She spent the next five years working as a behavioral therapist for special needs children while raising her daughter.

Tonisha moved to Tahoe in July 2018. Immediately after arriving,

she enrolled in a summer class at LTCC and began working at the Child Development Center. LTCC staff and students were very welcoming and helpful, providing her with resources that ensure she reaches her education goals. They also inspired her to give back as a peer navigator for the Lake Tahoe College Promise. In this role, she welcomes incoming Promise students and helps them get acclimated, much like she was welcomed when she arrived.

Tonisha received the Janice Tait and Soroptimist scholarships,

which will help her reach her educational goals. She plans to earn a degree in Psychology so she can become a marriage counselor.

### **Student Profile: Marcel Rowley**

Marcel Rowley is an LTCC student who is majoring in both Wilderness Education and Outdoor Leadership and Business. He also serves as the Veterans' Center Liaison at LTCC, providing resources and assistance to veterans who attend the college. Marcel is a four-year Army veteran who spent 15 months in Afghanistan. In addition to his studies, he runs his own laser engraving business and is a father to three children!

Marcel received the Mitch Underhill and Soroptimist 'Live Your Dream' scholarships this year. After he graduates, he plans to use his business and wilderness education skills to start a nonprofit at Lake Tahoe to get veterans out into the wilderness. These wilderness retreats will provide an escape to veterans working through the rigors associated with transitioning out of the service.

# **Student Success Grants Fund New Equipment and Unforgettable Experiences**

Your donations to the LTCC annual fund directly supported Student Success Grants for 2018/19. Grants were awarded to the Chemistry, Geology, Mathematics, and Equity departments, giving students valuable and unique education-enhancing experiences.

One grant allowed the Chemistry department to purchase essential lab equipment, including a gas portable instrument and a vacuum pump. The instruments have helped students in the General Chemistry and Organic Chemistry sequences.

Sean Ryland, chemistry instructor, said,

"Without the vacuum pump purchased with the help of the LTCC Foundation, only half the students would be able to complete the exercises each lab period."


The Mathematics department purchased 20 Chromebooks for use in pre-calculus and calculus class exams. The Chromebooks live in the library, and students can check them out when not in use for

exams. In the last year, students and faculty checked out the Chromebooks 725 times for both individual and classroom use!

The Geology department used its grant to offset trip expenses for 13 LTCC students in Geology 131AA: Grand Canyon. This four-unit, field-based course introduced students to the geology, hydrology, natural

history, and management issues of the Grand Canyon of the Colorado River. According to instructor Scott Valentine, "For Earth Science students, field experiences like these are rare, priceless gems that greatly contribute to the breadth and depth of their studies."

"The opportunity for this hands-on course provided an environment that promoted learning, exploration, and camaraderie. We were able to immerse ourselves in a time capsule spanning millions of years, with each destination providing a valuable lesson in geology, ecology, and indigenous history. Foundation assistance allowed me to effectively budget my time and resources to participate in this once-in-alifetime experience. "

In 1964, Roberta L. Mason was one of a small group of citizens who began laying the groundwork for a college in South Lake Tahoe. The group's efforts were successful, and Roberta continues to be a supporter and advocate for LTCC to this day.

Currently, Roberta serves as a valuable member of the LTCC Foundation Board of Directors. She was instrumental in securing the \$5.8M donation from Lisa Maloff for the University Center. Roberta's term on the foundation board started in 2015, immediately after she retired from her position as a trustee of the college (a position she held for 40 years!).

In addition to her support of LTCC, Roberta has served on a multitude of education-related committees and councils and is a member of the Soroptimist International of South LakeTahoe and the American Association of University Women.

In 2014, in appreciation of Roberta's five decades of hard work on behalf of the college and its students, the Board of Trustees voted to rename the LTCC Library in her honor.


### Lake Tahoe College Promise Donation Update


Stay tuned for an opportunity to support the College Promise to ensure all Lake Tahoe Basin high school graduates have financial and other support necessary to continue to higher education!
